Challenges

Background


In 2015, world leaders agreed on new and important goals for the future: Global Goals for Sustainable Development, also called Global Goals or World Goals.



"We are determined to liberate all people from poverty, and we want to look after our planet for the future", the 93 member countries stated when they agreed on the document <u>Transforming our</u> <u>World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.</u>

The Global Goals for Sustainable development were decided at UN's summit meeting for sustainable development on Sept. 25-27, 2015.

ASPnet and the Global Goals



When it adopted the new Agenda in September 2015, the international community recognized that education was essential for the success of all 17 of its goals. Ambitions for education are essentially captured in <u>Sustainable Development Goal 4</u> which aims to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all" <u>by 2030</u>.

ASPnet – a driver for innovation and quality in education – is recognized as an effective tool for reaching <u>target 4.7</u> on Global Citizenship Education (GCED) and Education for Sustainable Development (ESD).

This is why the Danish ASPnet invites 8 Danish ASP schools and 8 international partner schools to participate in the project, "The Global Goals for Sustainable Development".
