Global Goals Council

As a UNESCO SDG School, you are encouraged to set up a Global Goals Council, where students are represented and have democratic impact. In the Global Goals Council students act as representatives of their school and are responsible for communicating their school's experiences to others in the network.

Young Ambassadors

Every year, the UNESCO network provides training for future Young Ambassadors. Their task is through "youth-to-youth dissemination" to convey UNESCO's values and norms to pupils and students at the SDG Schools – thus creating knowledge, commitment and incentive to work with UNESCO's values and Global Goals.



An international innovation project

UNESCO SDG Schools are part of the UNESCO Associated Schools Project Network. The worldwide school network consists of 11.500 educational institutions in 182 countries. UNESCO SDG Schools will help in spreading the UN's 17 Global Goals as well as UNESCO's values of peace, intercultural understanding and tolerance.



SDG Schools in Denmark

The Danish part of the UNESCO's ASP network consists of primary schools, upper secondary education, vocational education, continuing education, folkhigh schools, VUC (Adult Education Centers) and vocational colleges with a total of more than 100.000 pupils / students and more than 10.000 employees. Schools are committed to working with sustainable development, global citizenship, and the dissemination of UNESCO values across disciplines and age groups.

Partnerships around the world

Through the international network, schools can establish partnerships and collaborate on academic themes. The network organizes youth conferences - most recently with the participation of young people from Ghana, Lebanon, Serbia, Spain, South Africa, Turkey, and the Virgin Island.

Global citizenship and sustainable development

UNESCO SDG Schools make a special contribution to achieving Global Goal 4: Quality Education. Since the launch of UN 17 Global Goals, the network has worked to spread the important message through education, activities and partnerships.

Professional themes such as intercultural competence, human rights, Climate Ready and the environment make up the network's content.
